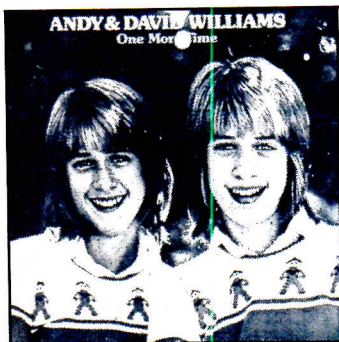
This month . . .

• SINGLE OF THE MONTH:

The Sweet: BLOCKBUSTER. The Sweet is the group who sang that hit, "Little Willy!" And this song is a blockbuster, too (maybe that's why the title??). It's from their album, "The Sweet," which is being released soon!

This is their second album for ABC-Dunhill, and there are three songs we just couldn't resist: "King of Rock 'n' Roll," "Is it Raining in New York City," and "AM-FM Blues" (this last one has sort of an in-joke for the industry!). This is an album with a lot of variety!

Don Agrati: HOMEGROWN. Don Agrati used to be known as "Don Grady"—that's right, one of "My Three Sons!" Now he's all grown up handsomely, too!) and he's writing and singing his own songs! He's very serious about it, too: For one song, he needed a marching band in the background, so he hired one to march by his recording studio and he recorded them!
