Star Singles:



KEANES

AMY (SHOW THE WORLD YOU'RE THERE)—Keane Brothers. We're off the Bi-Centennial kick now, but there's always Jimmy Carter! The "unknown goober"'s daughter stars in this one (the song's about her) and although it didn't make it to #1 yet, it has gotten some airplay so far! (20th Century Records)



CHAKA

AT MIDNIGHT (MY LOVE WILL LIFT YOU UP)—Rufus, featuring Chaka Khan. From the new album "Ask Rufus," this is the one we would've picked for the single, too! Chaka has really developed as a singer and this single certainly hints at the fact she might be leaving the group to try it on her own, as TB STAR reported to you! (CBC Records)

ALL STRUNG OUT ON YOU—John Travolta. John's new single is an oldie (originally by Nino Tempo and April Stevens), and if you're a Travolta fan, you'll definitely get the message! It's from John's new album, "Can't Let You Go"! (Midland Int.)

Star Albums:

LOW—David Bowie. His last five albums have all made top 10, and this one's on the way, even though a lot of reviewers find it a bit "strange"—and, it is. One side is really different from the other (we prefer side one).
