Star Singles:

CHEESEBURGER IN PARADISE—Jimmy Buffet. A fun follow-up to "Margaritaville," the lyrics are funny and it's a nice dancing song. (ABC)

EVEN NOW—Barry Manilow. The title song to his newest album is very dramatic, and Barry does it up right! All 10 of his previous singles on Arista Records have hit Top 30, and this one will have no problems. (Arista)

Star Albums:
