Star Singles:

CHICAGO — Kiki Dee. Produced by Elton John, who discovered Kiki a few years back. She hasn't released anything for awhile, but this will be a hit!

Star Albums:

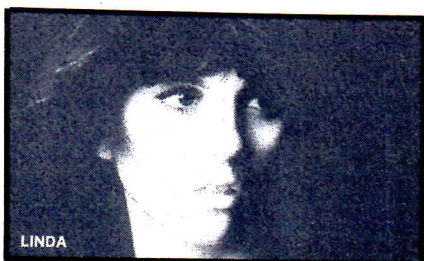
A SONG — Neil Sedaka. We love it! His first album on Elektra, it's got some great songs like "Amarillo" (his single), a catchy "You Never Done It Like That" and some wild-woman ones like "Sleazy Love" and "One-Night Stand" just for fun. (Elektra)



LIVE — Barry Manilow. It's a two-record set and has everything you could want (except Barry in person!). His hits ("Daybreak," "Could It Be Magic," "Mandy," etc.) recorded during his 98-city tour last year, a lot of folks will be buying it, including you, we'll bet! (Arista)

CAUGHT LIVE PLUS 5 — Moody Blues. The stuff is old (three sides recorded in 1969 at London's Royal Albert Hall, the other in 1967-68 but never released), but

it'll be right up at the top of the charts, because it's good stuff! "Gimme A Little Something" is a favorite of ours. (London)

Singles—"Me and My Music" by THE SPINNERS is a favorite, so's "While I'm Alone" by MAZE. . . . After BARBRA STREISAND's "Evergreen" stayed on the chart for over six months, KRIS KRISTOFFERSON decided to put out his song from "A Star Is Born" and released "Watch Closely Now"—and it's a hit, too!



Albums—BETTE MIDLER's "Live At Last" LP is a double-set with a lot of personality (all BETTE'S!) . . . she does "Mr. Rockefeller" and "Up the Ladder to the Roof" the best. . . . "Every Face Tells A Story" is CLIFF RICHARD's new one. . . . THE BEE GEES' newest, a live album with two records, is great! They're pro performers.
