TB STAR would like to go on record right now as to just how the newest songs sound to us!

Star Albums:

THIS IS THE WAY THAT I FEEL—Marie Osmond. Her best album yet! "Run to Me," "You're My Superman," and of course the title tune (also her new single) are all great. Love the cover, too! (Kolob/Polydor)



THE '50s AND '60s—Neil Sedaka. This is a reissue of some old things (including 4 songs never before released by Neil). Doesn't sound like he does today, but more like his "Calendar Girl" era — especially "Let's Go Steady Again." If you like Neil Sedaka, you must have this album! (RCA Records)

VIOLATION—Starz. "Cherry Baby" is, of course, included in this one. Now that they've been around the country and people have seen what they can do on stage, this album will be even more popular for just plain listening! (Capitol Records)

Star Singles:

YOU'RE NOT RIGHT FOR ME—Sonny & Cher. They shouldn't start the record off with Sonny's voice; however, eventually we get to Cher and it gets better! It's about two people who discover they aren't right for each other—which Sonny and Cher **should** be able to sing about easily! (Warner Bros. Records)

HIGH SCHOOL DANCE—Sylvers. Written by the Sylvers themselves, a lot of dancing rhythm here and their usual harmony (but this time a little bit more funky than "Hot-

line")—it's a great song! (Capitol Records)

THIS GIRL (HAS TURNED INTO A WOMAN)—Mary McGregory. She should've recorded this one before "Torn Between Two Lovers," considering the theme; but she has just as much hit-potential with it! She wrote it with her producer (singer/writer) Peter Yarrow.

Glimmers:

Singles—SHAUN CASSIDY's "Da Doo Ron Ron" is even better than LAVERNE AND SHIRLEY's version a few months back. Yea, Shaun! . . . JULIE BUDD, who's still young even though she's been in the biz for 11 years, has a new single out produced by her manager/producer from the beginning, Herb Bernstein — the single is "Music To My Heart" and she sounds better than ever . . . DAVID CASSIDY's "Saying Goodbye Ain't Easy (We'll Have To Go Away)" is the exact opposite of what he did with his new wife KAY LENZ!



Albums—EGG CREAM featuring Andy Adams has first album ("Egg Cream") which is pretty good for a first go-around—but like KLAATU, the guys in the band are anonymous! . . . "Dowdy Ferry Road" by ENGLAND DAN & JOHN FORD COLEY has some great slow songs and folksy songs on it. . . . ELVIS PRESLEY's "Welcome To My World" album is a reissue with some songs from his 1972 Madison Square Garden appearance. . . . Love B. J. THOMAS and his "Home Where I Belong" album is super — "You Were There to Catch Me" is our favorite.
