superSTAR would like to go on record right now as to just how the newest songs sound to us!

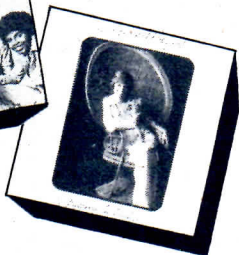
Star Albums:

SOMETHING SPECIAL—The Sylvers. This is really a super album for all Sylvers fans—it even has a message to the fans on the back! It's got "Hot Line," a big hit—and some other great songs like "Now I Want You" and "Disco Showdown (written by the Sylvers! Three other songs are, too). Doesn't Foster Sylvers look like Randy Jackson?! (Capitol).

KEEPING IN TOUCH—Anne Murray. Recorded just before the birth of her first baby, the album is filled with good songs. "A Million More" is folky and sentimental, "Shine" is a "yethir" vaudeville type, and no real "rockers" in this one! (Capitol).

JOYFUL JUKEBOX MUSIC—The Jackson 5 (Featuring Michael Jackson)—Michael's got some billing here, and he earns it! He's featured on every song—disco, soft & romantic, just plain rocking. "We're Here to Entertain You" sounds not only like their life story—with this album, it's true! (Motown).

LOVE AND CONVERSATION—Hamilton, Joe Frank & Dennison (no, not Reynolds). At last, a record that isn't disco! Well, a few songs, but not for the main part! "Get on the Bus" is about as different from "Old Habits" as you can get. The title tune is great! (Playboy).

SORRY SEEMS TO BE THE HARDEST WORD—Elton John. Kind of like "Don't Let the Sun Go Down On Me," and one of the better songs from his "Blue Moves" LP. A very complicated-sounding record, too! (MCA).



OB-LA-DI, OB-LA-DA—The Beatles. Yes, a re-release of the 1960's Beatles song, but it'll probably be big all over again. The Beatles never wear out! (Capitol).
