The Bee Gees: "THE BEE GEES LIVE." After a stint as one of the top groups of the '60's, the Bee Gees withdrew for awhile, and then came back to stun the music world with their great disco sounds. Now they've created their first live album that combines the best of both their kinds of music. "I've Gotta Get A Message To You" and "I Started A Joke" are just two of their older songs that come off sounding perfect, and "Jive Talkin'" and "Nights on Broadway" are a couple of the hot disco recordings that are impressive.

Heart: "LITTLE QUEEN." This is a good follow-up to their first album, "Dreamboat Annie," but it still doesn't quite measure up. Ann and her sister Nancy Wilson are two rarities in the rock world as top female rock artists. Some of the strongest cuts are "Barracuda," "Dream of the Archer," which has some beautiful mandolin playing, and "Go On Cry" with some fancy guitar work.

Kenny Loggins: "CELEBRATE ME HOME." When Kenny Loggins first started out to record a solo album, he ended up singing with Jimmy Messina for five years. They made some great music, and now Kenny has finally done his solo album. His easily recognizable voice sounds great on "Enter My Dream" and "Daddy's Back." Take a good listen to "Why Do People Lie" and "I've Got The Melody," too.
